### Tips for Anglers.

This is the first of several tips and information I am going to include in the newsletters.

### Fishing Reel Maintenance for Salt Water Reels

Here is a step by step list to ensure your pride and joy is with you for many more sessions to

How many times have you been keen for a fish, packed your gear, only to find your reel running a whole lot rougher than when you used it last? Or even worst, completely seized up or suffering from the dreaded green powdery corrosion? Unfortunately fishing in saltwater exposes fishing reels to one of the harshest environments out there, and if maintained incorrectly, you're not going to get the long happy life you were expecting out of your prized piece of fishing weaponry. In some cases, reels can even suffer from being loved too much, where going the unnecessary extra mile to look after your gear actually causes more harm than good. So, here is a step by step list to ensure your pride and joy is with you for many more sessions to come. It's actually a lot easier than you think!

- 1. Tighten the drags on all the reels you are wanting to clean. This prevents water entering into the drags washers and causing them to get soggy.
- 2. Fill a bucket with warm water and grab yourself a clean rag to put in it.
- 3. Thoroughly wipe the reel completely free of any crystallised salt and dried water marks.
- 4. Run warm water over the line, this prevents salt build up and corrosion in the spool and helps to keep your line in good condition.
- 5. Allow to air or towel down with a dry clean rag.
- 6. With a spray lubricant like reel guard, inox,or lannogaurd, spray each of the moving parts accessible from the outside of the reel. This includes the handle, bailarm hinges and line-roller bearing before loosening the drag.

Wipe away excess oil, return to padded reel case and store out of direct sunlight. There you have it guys, it's as simple as that! Remember under no circumstances spray your reels with a high pressure hose and never completely submerge them in water. This drives the salt and other grime into the reel rather than washing it away. It's also a great idea to send your reels back to the supplier to be serviced rather that attempting to fix them yourself. There's a whole heap of small little springs and parts inside most reels these days, so it's best to leave it to the professionals! Happy fishing guys!

# Inshore (Bream) & offshore (Pearl Perch) comps 24th May - 28th June

Our annual Bream and Pearl Perch month-long competition starts on the 24th May and goes to the 28th June this year. Which means, for anyone who is not familiar with this comp, that you can only weigh in Bream in the inshore comp, and Pearl Perch in the offshore comp <u>between these dates</u>. You can still catch and keep any other (legal) fish but you can't weigh them in.

Remember, Bream have to measure at least 27cm to qualify (for club weigh-in) and Pearl Perch 38cm.

There will only be one division covering all men, women, Juniors and Sub-Junior competitors. Prizes will be allocated for the largest fish inshore and offshore and the heaviest bag inshore & offshore weighed in during the month.





### Did You Know...?

Here are some more fun facts for you — this month, Pufferfish

- The pufferfish is the most poisonous fish in the sea but is harmless unless eaten. It can cause death in around 60% of people who do eat it. If prepared properly however, the puffer (or fugu) is edible and considered a delicacy in Japan and Korea.
- They are the only bony fish which can close their eyes, but they don't have eyelids. Instead, they pull their eyeballs deep within their sockets, and then squeeze the skin surrounding the eye closed.
- When a pufferfish is threatened they fill themselves with water, making themselves into a spiny ball three to four times their normal size.
- The male pufferfish makes huge, beautiful nests 2 m across in the sand, to attract a mate, which takes him a week or more to make. They even decorate their creations with shells. They never reuse the nest, always constructing a new one despite the time and effort it takes.
- Adult puffer fish have just four teeth, fused together into one strong beak which they use to open clams or mussels, and scrape algae off rocks.
- The larvae of the tiger puffer fish, once it has grown its first teeth, will bite lumps out of its siblings, causing many deaths.
- Puffer fish range in size from the tiny freshwater pygmy puffer fish at 3.5 cm to the giant puffer fish, also found in freshwater, at 67 cm long.
- Dolphins have been filmed playing with pufferfish, tossing them between each other for 20 to 30 minutes at a time. Afterwards they're shown swimming "dreamily", as if they'd got a high from touching them.
